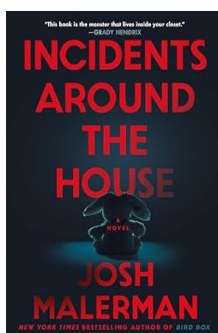
Check out these haunted house-themed recommendations from Inman's Branch Assistant, Abby.
